

We could not have imagined this - another addition is needed to the building. We are so grateful to God for the expanding enrollment. Not only South Christian, but Byron Center Christian, Dutton Christian and Moline Christian are all in an expansion mode. It is exciting to see families choosing Christian education.

The new building was designed for 700 students at a time when we had only 630. At this point, we are anticipating 710 students this fall. The following school year we are anticipating 760 students. To accommodate the growth, the plan is to expand the building to the northeast. The addition will include 12 classrooms and be approximately 21,000 square feet.


TUITION ASSISTANCE UPDATE

BENEFITS OF GIVING FROM YOUR IRA



The Board has requested that 80% of the project be committed by September 30. We are thrilled that Dan Vos Construction Company has lowered the price and now we need \$6.8 million by September 30. With almost \$4 million committed, that leaves \$2.8 million that needs to be raised. We give thanks to God for this amount.

In an effort to reach the goal, would you please consider a pledge for 2024 and 2025 before September **30?** At that time the Board will make a decision if we can build the addition now or if it needs to be pushed off for six months or a year. If the funds are not received, accommodations will need to be made. Students may find themselves in a variety of interesting locations for some of their classes.

The Sailors had a very strong showing and finished 4th in Division 2 after the 36 hole event. SC shot a school record 296 on Day 2, which was the lowest of any school at the event on that day to lead to the 4th place finish. 
Congratulations to the Jazz Band for their third straight year of earning a 1 at MSBOA District Jazz Band Festival.

ALUMNI REFLECTION

ALUMNI BEACON



Like many others, I volunteered to go to war in a conflict that was far away from home, literally and figuratively. I joined the Marine Corps two years after graduating from South Christian and deployed to Africa in 2003. I was then deployed a second time, to Iraq, in 2006 and was promoted to squad leader just before leaving the U.S.

Our time in and around Fallujah included difficult and intense firefights in addition to great fun and camaraderie. It was challenging, dangerous and vacillated between incredibly boring and incredibly intense. Over time we worked together with local tribal militias who switched alliances and joined the fight against the Al Qaedabacked insurgents. My squad performed well, and we were fortunate to leave Iraq seven months later with no physical injuries even though dozens of others in our company were not as fortunate.

My story then entered a new phase as I returned home and jumped back into work, school, church and family life. From the outside, everything seemed to be going well. I had a beautiful wife, several young children, had earned a degree with the GI Bill, and was active in church leadership. By all accounts it appeared as if my combat experiences were a small sentence in the story of my life. In reality those experiences had shaded my story in ways that I could not comprehend.

Eventually my life hit a point where I couldn't pretend everything was okay anymore. I had always been a Christian, but over time I drifted away from God and saw him as a distant and judgmental figure. Rather than standing on my own achievements as I had tried to do for so long, I approached God as a broken and defeated soul and was greeted with grace and understanding. That started my healing journey. I still struggle to find perspective in all areas of life but I am living as one who is redeemed.
